Job Description for **Peer Minister**

1. General Duties

Peer Ministers are leaders in the Newman Center student community and it is important that they lead by example. Peer Ministers serve as role models by being present at the Newman Center regularly, participating in Newman Center activities and prayer, and attending all major Newman Center events. Peer Ministers are witnesses to Christ in their commitment to their fellow students. Peer ministers should be especially open to developing evangelization skills. As disciples we are called to spread the Gospel by both word and deed to Catholics and non-Catholics alike. Peer Ministers work to heed Jesus' command: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Mt 28:19).

2. Specific Duties

- Attend Sunday Mass weekly and other liturgies and devotions (e.g. Rosary, Liturgy of the Hours, daily Mass) multiple times a week
- Be a friendly and welcoming presence at the Newman Center and during all Newman Center activities, especially towards new students
- Participate in both the weekly Peer Ministry planning meeting and weekly Peer Ministry team development
- Support fellow Peer Ministers in organizing, advertising, and running events
- Participate in and promote Newman's major events
- Recruit and involve other students in Newman's activities
- Communicate with the Chaplain any ideas, concerns, or suggestions
- Be a good steward of the Newman Center facility and its resources

3. Peer Minister Qualities

Being a Peer Minister will offer many opportunities for growth, so Peer Ministers should strive to be faithful, friendly, dedicated, responsible, flexible, cooperative, and welcoming.

4. Commitment

Peer Ministers should expect to invest several hours each week planning, praying, attending events, and being accessible members of the community. The time commitment will vary from week to week, but Peer Ministers should see themselves ALWAYS as representatives of the Newman Center and should be a positive, Catholic Christian image on campus.

5. Balance and Delegation

Peer Ministers are vital for the workings of Peer Ministry, but this does not mean that they need to do everything. Peer Ministers plan and organize Newman events and activities, but they must also be able to recruit other students and delegate roles to them. Delegation ensures that the Peer Ministers are not overloaded and can involve a wider range of Newman Center students.

6. Specific Roles

Peer Ministers help coordinate the following at the Newman Center:

Social events, social media and advertising, Sunday meals, intramural sports, guest speakers, retreats, and community service

Job Description for **Peer Ministry President & Vice President (VP)**

1. **General Duties of both President and VP**

The President and VP assume all the general duties of the Peer Minister in addition to being servant leaders in the community and embracing a greater level of responsibility and time commitment. The President/VP work closely with the chaplain and Peer Ministry team to cultivate the community's involvement and growth in line with the mission statement of the Newman Center.

2. **Specific Duties of both President and VP**

- Be an exceptionally active, positive, and welcoming presence at the Newman Center and at events
- Meet with the chaplain weekly to coordinate the activities and needs of the Newman Center
- Motivate the Peer Ministry team to strive for excellence in their duties as Peer Ministers
- Hold accountable Peer Ministers who fall behind in their roles and help them when necessary
- Monitor Newman Center activities to ensure that student actions are appropriate and in keeping with Church teachings

3. **Stipend**

Both the Peer Ministry President and Vice President are compensated by a \$600 stipend (\$300 per semester).

Peer Ministry President

1. **General Duties**

The Peer Ministry President works closely with the chaplain to establish and carry out the vision for Peer Ministry. The President coordinates the specific tasks of Peer Ministry to ensure that everyone is doing their part in a timely fashion and that the workload is being evenly distributed.

2. **Specific Duties**

- Plan and lead weekly Peer Ministry planning meetings
- Assist Peer Ministers and other student leaders who are planning Newman events and activities
- Coordinate emails, phone calls, posters, and other announcements regarding Peer Ministry activities
- Communicate the chaplain's vision for Peer Ministry to the team
- Assist the VP with team development when needed

Peer Ministry Vice President

1. **General Duties**

The Vice President plays a supporting role to the President to ensure the smooth operations of the Peer Ministry team. The Vice President is responsible for the team's well-being and positive attitude. A unified team makes for a fruitful ministry, and the Vice President works to ensure healthy team dynamics.

2. **Specific Duties**

- Coordinate weekly team development
- Plan team activities and hangouts
- Check in with individual team members occasionally to ensure their well-being
- Lead meetings in the President's absence
- Assist the President when needed
