**Thursday, Feb 21 – 6p**

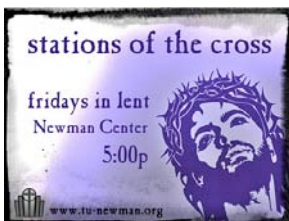
