



May: The Month of the Blessed Virgin Mary



"Since Mary is rightly to be regarded as the way by which we are led to Christ, the person who encounters Mary cannot help but encounter Christ likewise. For what other reason do we continually turn to Mary except to seek the Christ in her arms, to seek our Savior in her, through her, and with her?" - Pope Paul VI, Encyclical "Mense Maio"

American Mother's Day was established in 1908, but the tradition of specially honoring Mary, the mother of our Savior, during the month of May dates back to the 13th century. Many Popes, such as Pius XII and Paul VI, have encouraged this devotion. As the blog Salt + Light puts it, "Devotion to Mary is one an important part of the Catholic identity. As our mother she is an example of a committed 'Yes' to the will of God."
